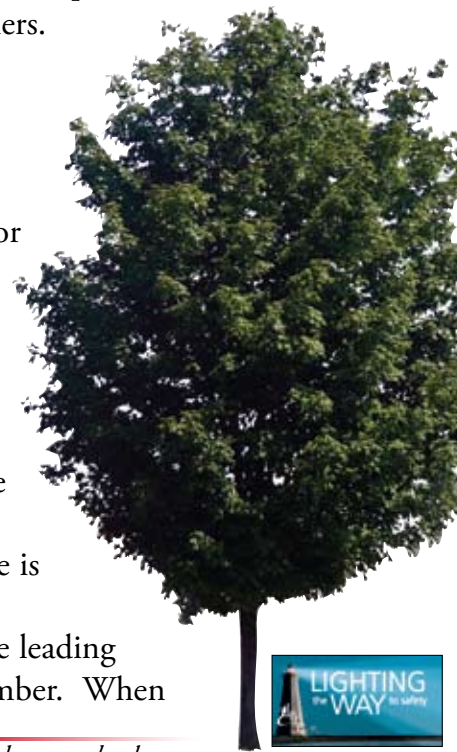

Trees in power lines are a leading cause of power outages for Jackson Purchase Energy customers. The recent wind storm in September and the devastating ice storm in February have certainly proven this fact to JPEC members. To ensure quality service, JPEC offers member-owners the option to "trade trees" or receive cash compensation for the tree the company removes.

Any JPEC member can participate in the program. Just check your yard for trees growing into primary power lines. Keep in mind, primary power lines are those lines that serve more than just your home. The electric line from the pole to your house is not a primary power line.

Trees in a secondary line (like the line leading to a home), are the responsibility of the member. When

On occasion, Jackson Purchase Energy is able to work with contacts in the energy industry to obtain special deals for JPEC members.

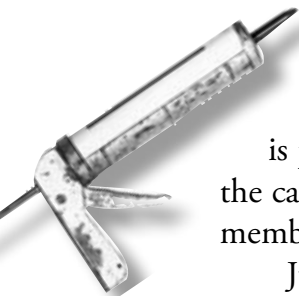
Earlier this year JPEC was able to secure several cases of caulk and the company is pleased to offer the caulk to JPEC members at no charge.

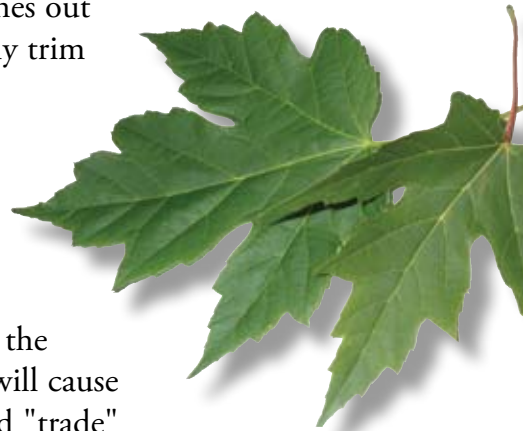
possible, JPEC will temporarily move lines out of the way in order for members to safely trim trees.

After you have determined you may have an eligible yard tree in a primary line, contact any customer service representative by phone or online to schedule a time for a JPEC field representative to check the tree. If the field representative determines the tree will cause problems, JPEC will remove the tree and "trade" you for a new tree. You can select to either "trade trees" and work with a participating nursery, or you can elect to receive \$100 in lieu of trading, for up to four trees.

If you choose to trade trees, you will be able to select your own tree and the location where the new tree will be planted. JPEC, of course, will not plant the new tree under existing power lines. The company's partner nurseries will advise you as to the right tree for your needs and the best location for the new tree. They will plant the tree at the best time of year as specified by American Nursery Standards within one year of your request. Plus, the nursery will guarantee the new tree for a full year.

Holly Nursery in Calvert City and Lawn Tamers in Kevil are JPEC's partner nurseries in the Trade-A-Tree Program.

The Board Report

The following items were approved at the Sept. 25, 2008, regular board meeting: a consent agenda including minutes of the August board meeting, the August Operating Report and the board of directors' fees and expenses for August.

The board heard a report from JPEC's representatives on the Big Rivers Electric Board and a report from the Kentucky Association of Electric Cooperatives Board Meeting. In addition, reports were presented by JPEC's vice presidents and the president/CEO.

The board formed a committee, made up of board members and employees, to work on communications during major outage events. The scope of work will include a review of the phone system as well as looking at other technologies that may make it easier for JPEC members to report outages and get updates.

Board meetings are normally held the fourth Thursday of the month. However, November's board meeting will be held on Nov. 25, 2008, because of Thanksgiving. Members wishing to address the board must contact the CEO's office at least seven working days prior to the meeting.
